

ARRIVAL

MIGRATION ISSUES

Citizens of countries outside the EU/EEA area should apply for national D visa before arriving in Lithuania. It is your responsibility to apply for a national D visa. The exchange students, who can enter the country without visa and stay here for three months, shall apply for national visa D within these three months in the Migration Department of the Republic of Lithuania. The decision on the issue of visa D shall be made within 15 days after the receipt of application. For full time students - after national D visa next step is temporary residence permit. All citizens of countries outside the EU/EEA area must apply for it prior to visa termination, approximately 4 months in advance.

Citizens of EU/EEA countries can enter Lithuania on the basis of their Passport or EU Identity Card. After their arrival students should register their residence if they come to live in the Republic of Lithuania for more than 3 months in a 6-month period, and obtain a certificate signifying the right to temporarily reside in Lithuania. Students have to do so within 3 months of arrival in Lithuania.

INSURANCE

All students are responsible for having valid insurance covering the whole duration of their stay, including travel to and from Lithuania. Students can obtain health and travel insurance from home country or Lithuania insurance companies.

Citizens of countries outside the EU/EEA must obtain insurance that guarantees the coverage of costs and expenses of the emergency medical aid, which may occur due to the students' return to the foreign state due to health issues (transportation, including the escort of a personal health care expert (experts)), as defined in the Law on Health System of the Republic of Lithuania. The insurance amount must be at least 30 000 Euros. The health insurance should be valid in Lithuania and in all Schengen area.

HEALTHCARE FOR EU/EEA CITIZENS

If you want be treated the same as a resident of Lithuania, follow the further steps:

STEP 1.

Get your European Health Insurance Card (EHIC) at your home country before leaving. EHIC covers only emergency medical care.

STEP 2.

Get a temporary residence certificate once you are in Lithuania. Contact migration@ism.lt to receive our help with the process. More information as well as the documents needed can be found [here](#). 

STEP 3.

Ask for S1 document (certificate of entitlement to healthcare, if you don't live in the country where you are insured) in health insurance institution of your home country. Look for more information and details about this document while you are still at home to make sure that you will be able to get it.

STEP 4.

Ask Lithuanian territorial health insurance funds to register your S1 document. You can either send the copy of it via email vltk@vltk.lt or bring it to Vilnius Territorial Health Insurance Fund (Ž. Liauksmo street 6, Vilnius). This will allow you to visit family doctors and receive other healthcare services in Lithuania for free.

Tips on renting in Vilnius 

OPENING A BANK ACCOUNT

If you are here for Erasmus exchange, it is most likely that you will not need to open a bank account as you can use ATM's to withdraw the money. However, if you are a full-time student and will find a job here, you may want to open a bank account.

If you decide to do so, remember to always have your ID card with you when going to the bank. If you decide to open the bank account, you will need to bring your ID, student card (ISIC) and Student status confirmation (Order it via MY.ISM system).

- Please note that most banks are open on weekdays until 17:00

STUDENT CARDS

There are three student cards available for you – ISIC, ESN and LSP cards and they offer various discounts.



ISIC

This card acts as an official student card in Lithuania. Up to 50% discount on the Lithuanian public transport, plus various other discounts.

ESN

This card offers various discounts on transport, accommodation and services in all EU countries.

LSIC (LSP)

One more card that is also an official student card in Lithuania. This card is best for full-time students because once you buy it, it is valid for the entire period of your studies. It also gives you various discounts in Lithuania (including 50% on public transport).



CAMPUS

We are glad to inform you that ISM is being relocated to the very centre of the capital – to Vilnius' former Central Post Office, located in Gediminas Avenue 7.

Modern and efficient premises will be adapted to our students, academics and administration. The new location, next to the Bank of Lithuania, the Lithuanian Science Council, the Lithuanian Government, other business and cultural centres, will make it easier to feel the pulse of science, business and society.

The 5,400 square meter space will house auditoriums, offices, a modern library, dedicated places for student learning and collaboration, and spaces for events and recreational activities. The former building of Vilnius' Central Post Office will be renovated, while preserving its historical heritage and using innovative technologies.

E-MAIL SYSTEM (webmail.ism.it)

We send all important information via ISM e-mail so check your student mailbox regularly! Tip: download Outlook app to your phone and get a notification each time you receive an e-mail.



MY ISM SYSTEM (my.ism.it)

Timetable, grades, financial information, personal data, exchange, admissions, references.

References – order your reference through my.ism.It system and take it from study office or download it from my.ism.It portal. You will be informed when it is ready via e-mail. Usually it takes up to two working days.



E LEARNING SYSTEM (elearning.ism.it)

Learning material, forms of requests, all studies related documents.



HELPDESK (helpdesk.ism.it)

Reporting problems, changing password, connecting to “eduroam” WiFi network and many other useful tips & tricks.



MyQ SYSTEM

Printing/copying – MyQ vouchers are sold at ISM Library. You can find instructions on how to use MyQ System on helpdesk.ism.it



MS Teams

Place where online lectures are happening. Use the same log in as for any other ISM internal systems or take a look at the instructions on helpdesk.ism.it

ASSESSMENT

ISM uses 10-point (10 being the highest possible grade, and 1 – the lowest) grading scale and Cumulative Grade Formula. Classes are assessed continuously (participation, small projects, group and individual work, presentations, etc.).

Cumulative Grading:

In most cases, the final grade for course is formed from the midterm and final exam grades, as well as the assignment grades together. Each of these grades have different percentile values that depend on the course. For more information, please check the syllabus of each course.

Failing grades are not calculated into the final grade. Please note that 4,99 point is still considered failing and counts as 0 in the cumulative grade.

EXAMINATION PERIOD

Exam period is organized at the end of each semester or at the end of each module.

Final exam period schedules are announced a month before the start of the exams.

The final exam session during Fall semester for Bachelor exchange students is arranged in mid-December, so the exchange semester is finished before Christmas Holidays. In case of failed exams, students must be present in January as well, since exam retakes are organized in the second half of the month.

For spring semester there is no earlier exam session, exchange students take their exams along with regular students. Retake exams are organized in the second half of June.

In addition to the final examination, there is a two-week midterm session that takes place at the end of October during Fall semester and at the end of March during Spring semester. There are no retake periods for the mid-term exams.

Exchange students are evaluated the same way as regular ISM students and no exceptions regarding grading, exam dates or organization mode are applied.

IMPORTANT INFO FOR MASTER STUDENTS

Please note that Master courses have a special schedule: they usually take place from 5 PM - 9 PM, in modules of 1 – 3 intensive weeks per course and the exams are held right after each course. **Therefore, there is no regular exam session for Master courses.** Master students have classes in the evenings and/or on Saturdays

If Master students also select Bachelor level (undergraduate) courses, they will need to attend classes throughout the whole semester and follow both Master and Bachelor course and examination schedules.



Do not forget that time change happens in Lithuania. Daylight saving time starts on March as we turn the clocks 1 hour forward. Daylight saving time ends on October as we turn the clocks 1 hour backward.

LITHUANIAN LANGUAGE

A Lithuanian Language Crash Course is organized during the Welcome Week for all new incoming international students.

If you are interested in learning more and showing off your skills while communicating with the locals you can sign up for a Lithuanian Language course for Beginners and attend the classes throughout the semester (2 lectures per week, 1,5h each, 6 ECTS). The course is free of charge.

The classes are organized if 10 or more students register to the course.



TICKETS

You can buy an electronic ticket called “Vilniečio kortelė” in all Narvesen kiosks, newspaper kiosks or Maxima supermarket. Vilniečio kortelė can be credited with an appropriate amount of money and/or the selected public transport tickets (30min, 1 day, entire month, etc.) Once you have a valid ticket in the card, you need to activate it on board of a public vehicle. New Vilniečio kortelė costs €1,5.

M.TICKET

You can also buy public transport tickets on m.Ticket or Trafik mobile apps.

Cold beetroot soup.






